Dear Neighbor,

This letter is to inform you that National Grid will commence construction of a natural gas pipeline in your area on or around March 11, 2019. The Pipeline 34 Replacement Project is needed to strengthen the safety of the pipeline to maintain reliable transmission service within National Grid's Eastern New York gas service territory. The Project calls for replacing an approximately 3-mile portion of Pipeline 34, an existing gas transmission pipeline located between National Grid's gas regulator station at 364 Walnut Street in the City of Oswego and Dutch Ridge Road in the Town of Scriba.

The existing Pipeline 34 is an 8-inch diameter steel pipeline approximately 11 miles long that runs north-south from the City of Oswego to the Town of Fulton. The portion of the pipeline to be replaced will feature a new, technologically advanced pipe that is 10 inches in diameter. It is important to note that much of the 3 miles of existing pipe to be replaced will be retired in place; a small section will be removed to facilitate connection of the new piping.

In early March, construction vehicles, wooden mats and other equipment will be transported to various staging areas along the entire 3-mile route. For your safety, do not enter any construction sites and please inform your children not to play in or around these areas. Please be aware that you may smell gas outside as crews are working. If you are concerned about a possible leak inside your home, immediately call 1-800-892-2345 or 911.

There will be no interruption of natural gas service to any National Grid customers throughout the duration of the Project. Crews will be working on site Monday through Saturday 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and we anticipate that the completion of construction will be in November 2019.
